Theme I**THEME I**

Catherine MacDonald welcomed the theme presenter, Michael Dowd, who spoke to the theme *Faith Forward*. Speaking to the gathering, he encouraged us to live in right relations going forward and expanded on his theme *The Future is Calling us to Greatness*. Michael Dowd invited us to think about the big picture; what is inevitable, what is futile and what is urgent. He explained that there are five stages of awakening: Dead Asleep, Awareness of one fundamental problem, Awareness of many problems, Awareness of interconnection of many problems, and Awareness that our predicament encompasses all aspects of life. Time was offered for table group discussion and the council members were invited to submit questions that would be answered by video. Michael Dowd will be also offering a workshop session on Saturday.

Faith March-MacCuish, Executive Minister, introduced the staff; Kendall Harrison, David Hewitt, Laura Hunter, Lauren King, Jennifer Taylor, Jennifer Whittemore, Sarah Wallace, Tracey Rose and Leona Laundry and explained their roles and responsibilities in this new structure. The Executive Minister also introduced Andrew Richardson and Roger Janes, General Council staff who are deployed to the eastern regions of the United Church.

Marlene Trenholme was welcomed. Faith March-MacCuish presented her with a certificate for her 23 (twenty-three) years with The United Church of Canada and thanked her for her work with the Maritime Conference. Laura Hunter was invited to read a poem, prepared for Marlene Trenholme for the occasion.

Andrew Richardson, Office of Vocation Minister, addressed the council. The Office of Vocation is part of the national church, with staff deployed to the regions. The Office of Vocation is responsible for the standard of training and accreditation of ministry personnel. The OV also works to determine fitness and readiness of students for ordination and recognition; and works to determine standards within the nationally set policies. The Office of Vocation works closely with the Regional Minister in each region. **PASTORAL RELATIONS****Pastoral  
Relations**

Kendall Harrison, Regional Minister for Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Regional Council, and David Hewitt, Regional Minister for Regional Council 15 spent time explaining the pastoral relations processes in the new system and ChurchHub.

The Regional Minister is the first point of contact for any pastoral relations process. Policies are in development, and new forms are being developed; we are in the midst of change. The best advice is to be in touch right away before assuming that old processes are still in place. Generally speaking, the terminology and personnel, structures and committees have changed, but we have combined resources and can benefit from shared staff. Many of the pieces of work remain the same, however we have new processes, such as the Living Faith Story as a tool for planning and vitality and the report now being a profile on ChurchHub.

A presentation was provided on how to access ChurchHub and the information contained on the site for both Ministry Personnel and Communities of Faith. Members were also directed to The United Church of Canada website for additional training. The Regional Ministers invited questions from the floor and also provided their contact information for additional support.

**MILITARY CHAPLAINCY MESSAGE****Military

Capt. Keith Gale, Military Chaplain, was introduced. Military chaplains live and work with their unit; in the field and at the base. This is an important ministry which is both challenging and rewarding. Capt. Gale thanked the United Church for preparing him for accepting all faiths, diversity of culture and gender, and the tools to move into his role as chaplain; ministering to those who are struggling with faith in a very real way because of what they see and what they do in service.

A video message was played from the Moderator, the Right Rev. Dr. Richard Bott bringing greetings from the General Council Office. The Moderator asks that we join in celebrating the changes happening in the United Church and reach out in our Communities of Faith to support and encourage each other. The General Council Office and Rt. Rev. Dr. Bott send their payers and support.

Jane McDonald and Kate Rodd, addressed the council. Kate Rodd, Executive Minister of Communications at General Council Office offered congratulations to the two regions gathered for embracing the changes in the church and accomplishing a great deal of work to date, culminating with this inaugural gathering.

Jane McDonald, General Council Executive member, is currently serving a 6 (six) year term on the General Council Executive. The Executive reflect the diversity within the United Church and oversee key points for The United Church of Canada, including guiding principles and vision in this new structure, faith formation, mission support and indigenous rights. She thanked the council members for their support and provided contact information for any communities of faith who have issues to bring to the national church.

**HOW WE MEET****How We Meet**

Faith March-MacCuish, Executive Minister, asked for discernment and feedback to have a conversation about the possibilities of future gatherings. Discussions should consider the financial implications of gatherings, as well as core values and priorities as two different regions develop new governance and structure.

Other topics for consideration include how to host the Celebration of Ministries Service and issues related to timing. Finally, consideration needs to be given to the youth and how they are to be included in the future. The Executive Minister suggested that the council members take table group time to have open discussion; allowing all opinions to be heard and being considerate to those with different opinions. Table groups were asked to make notes of their discussions and submit them, so that the Executive would have feedback for future directions for Regional Council meetings.

Many options exist for meetings, as the new Manual only requires that Regional Councils meet annually. This can be a meeting of full membership, or a meeting of the Executive; as determined by the Regional Council. Meetings may take place jointly, separately, through technology or a combination of all.

Questions and comments were taken from the floor, and discussion and decisions will continue when the Regional Councils meet individually for their own business.

Emma Seamone offered an indigenous voice, discussing the history of the Wabanakis and illustrating their traditional territory. Christian settlers throughout history have failed to see how our lives brought suffering to the indigenous people. In order to live *Faith Forward* we need to recognize that we settle on these lands based only on the generosity of the indigenous people in spite of the toxic relationship with settlers.

Emma left the council with the message to learn to listen to understand. Our future faith looks like us loving each other more than we love power.

Faith March-MacCuish, Executive Minister, presented the report of the Regional Transition Commission. The Commission were tasked with the mandate to function as Executive from January 1, 2019 until the Regional Council forms a new executive at the inaugural meeting; and to make the decisions necessary to allow immediate functioning of the new Regional Council; such as budgets, staffing, shared staffing, property matters, the planning of the inaugural meeting of the regional council and any unfinished business from presbyteries and conference; including Mission Support Grants. A Memorandum of Understanding was put in place to address shared staff and services among the three regions.

The Executive Minister introduced the members of the Commission and thanked them for their work in completing these difficult tasks.

That the Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Regional Council endorse the work of the Commission and the new Executive be asked to complete any remaining work from the Transition Commission.

A surplus of \$37,000 (thirty-seven thousand) is shown, which may be used to fund any new applications received for mission support.

**MEETING MOVING FORWARD**

Faith March-MacCuish introduced the discussion regarding meetings moving forward in the new structure. The Executive Minister presented the process for discussion. The Regional Council Executive recommends that the regional council have full meetings for the next three years and that the Executive then be directed to assess the ways in which the Region will meet in the future. If the regional council agrees then we will have to decide on how we meet in 2020, ie. whether the Regional Council meets together with Regional Council 15 or separately (different date and place).

The Executive Minister shared that the table groups had given some good suggestions for moving forward and that the Executive and annual planning committee would need time to go through the suggestions.

That Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Regional Council have full annual meetings for the next three years (2019, 2020, 2021) and that the Regional Council Executive assess the way we will meet in the future with any changes to be approved by the Regional Council.

## PROPOSAL

## PROPOSAL: Toward Deepening Intercultural Leadership

Origin: Justice, Mission, and Outreach Committee of Region 15/ Justice, Mission, and Outreach Committee of Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region

1. **What is the issue?** *(describe in broad terms)*

In light of the discussions on racism experienced within our denomination that developed at the 43<sup>rd</sup> General Council in Oshawa, the Justice, Mission and Outreach Committees of Region 15 and Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region believe the Holy Spirit is calling our Regions to:

- Affirm our commitment as Region 15/ Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region to living into interculturalism and racial justice within all levels of our ministries (at the congregational and regional levels) in practical ways.
- Support congregations to engage in this important ministry by supporting clergy within Region 15/ Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region to access transformative, denominationally-approved in-person intercultural and racial justice training that is especially pertinent to life in the Maritime regions.

2. **Why is this issue important?** *What are the key underlying theological, ecclesiological, missional, or justice issues? What is the history/background of this issue? What are the principles informing this issue? What would be the implications of taking no action on this issue?*

According to the United in Learning website, “Racial justice training for **all active ministry personnel** was mandated at the 39th General Council 2006. The proposal came out of a long history of the United Church’s engagement with issues of social justice [such as being called to respond to the pain and injustices caused by racism, both in our communities of faith and in wider society]. In 2000, the United Church adopted its Anti-Racism Policy statement; racial justice training is one effort to help the church continue to live out its principles.”<sup>1</sup>

Currently, this five-hour training program is offered via a two-day, online course through the United in Learning program. However, in light of the discussions on racism that developed at the 43<sup>rd</sup> General Council, the Justice, Mission and Outreach Committees of Region 15 and Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region feel it is important that a more robust, interactive and in-person racial justice training would be beneficial to leaders in the church.

As people striving to follow in the love and Way of Jesus Christ, we are living in a time when it is critical that communities of faith stand up against racism and oppression and live into the call to become intercultural communities. To do this, it is critical that clergy have a deep understanding of racism, privilege and white supremacy, as well as how to help create brave spaces of inclusion.

It is the opinion of the Justice, Mission and Outreach Committees that in-person racial justice training delivered by leaders experienced with the local context would be more challenging and transformative for participants than an online course because participants would be able to go

a better understanding of how to live out racial justice in practical ways and would therefore be better equipped leaders for our communities in this time.

Furthermore, we already have a Maritime-based training centre in our midst that is a national and denominational leader in racial justice and anti-oppression training. The Tatamagouche Centre has been a leader in racial justice work in our denomination and within the Maritimes since 1992. The Centre currently offers the “Building Bridges” program, which is an in-person racial justice and anti-oppression training program grounded in the experiences of people based in the Maritimes, which would be more beneficial for Maritime-based clergy responding to local and regional issues and needs.

In addition to this, by supporting the Tatamagouche Centre through promoting its “Building Bridges” program as an alternative to the online racial justice training for clergy, Region 15 and Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region would continue the important work of economically supporting Maritime workers contracted and employed through the Tatamagouche Centre, as well as ensuring that expert, excellent racial justice facilitation can continue to happen within the Maritimes.

**1. How might the Council of Action respond to the issue?** *Name a possible response that the Council of action might consider:*

- Direct the Executive Minister of Region 15/ Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region to send a letter of support to the Office of Vocation requesting that they endorse the Tatamagouche Centre’s “Building Bridges” program as a recognized and acceptable racial justice training for those requiring mandatory training. with Region 15/ Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region.
- Direct the Executive of Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region to seek a means of financially subsidizing the participation of those requiring mandatory training in order to make the Tatamagouche Centre’s racial justice training program of equal cost to the United in Learning racial justice webinar training.
- Affirm our commitment as Region 15/ Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region to living into interculturalism and racial justice within all levels of our ministries (at the congregational and regional levels) by prioritizing the development of programs, practices, and concrete goals - including education on white privilege.
