CALL TO ORDER

Call to Order

The President, Grant Stuckless, welcomed everyone to the fourth annual meeting of First Dawn Eastern Edge Regional Council and called the meeting to order. The Liturgy Team, led by Gneid Lackey, opened the meeting with scripture, song, reflection and prayer. Wayne Blackwood offered an opening prayer. Grant Stuckless, President, offered a scripture reading from the Gospel of Mark 12:28-31, and introduced the theme *Presence and Hope: Health and Wellness*. The President shared that, in these most difficult pandemic times, it is more important than ever to care for ourselves and each other. Let us continue to be faithful and present to each other in healthy community, inspired by the Holy Spirit among us. Larry Noseworthy and Jocelyn Cook provided music leadership.

Moderator

The Moderator, the Right Rev. Dr. Richard Bott, shared opening remarks via video message. The Moderator shared that so much change is going on in the world right now. It is not an easy world to understand during pandemic, wars, climate change, disease, and so much more that is hard to even bring into words. The Moderator thanked members for being themselves, and for being here for each other and the greater community, as we go into this world together in bold discipleship. The Moderator asks also that we continue to gather and celebrate one another.

Health and Wellness Moment

HEALTH AND WELLNESS MOMENT

Regional Council members participated in a Zumba fitness moment, in keeping with the theme *Presence and Hope: Health and Wellness*.

Theme

THEME

Program Team Convenor, Stephanie McClellan, introduced the theme speaker, Adam Hanley, Program Coordinator, Ministry Personnel Vitality, General Council Office. The theme presenter shared that he is pleased to be able to join us in this virtual space to speak about the theme; health and wellness. Adam shared a slideshow presentation which defined wellness as our physical health, and something that can be measured; as opposed to wellbeing. When considering wellbeing, or how we are doing, we can consider four factors: everyday happiness; resilience; self-integrity or authenticity; and thriving, or the values and meaning in our lives. Members were asked to share in the chat what feeling well looks like, feels like, tastes like and smells like.

We lament struggles with mental health, the sense of uncertainty, the pandemic, those we have lost. There have been financial losses and uncertainty in our communities of faith. It has not been an easy journey. We yearn to flourish. Our focus on health and wellness in the church includes a responsibility for health, joy and excellence for ministry personnel. This theme time is guided by the scripture from Mark 12:28-31. The scripture refers to heart, soul, mind, strength; reminiscent of the quadrants of wellness; physical (strength), mental (mind), spiritual (soul), and emotional (heart).

The theme presenter encouraged members to focus on a theme question: What practices would you have fun engaging with? The members were led through practices in boundaries, and activities that help in creativity and re-energizing. Members answered the question What are your favorite practices for emotional wellness?

Procedural Motion

PROCEDURAL MOTION

Stephanie McClellan and Cecil Noseworthy of the Program Team presented the opening procedural motion.

MOTION: (Stephanie McClellan/Cecil Noseworthy)

That the Roll of First Dawn Eastern Edge Regional Council be (Manual 2022 C.1.1 and C.1.2):

- a) Members of the order of ministry within the bounds served by the regional council;
 and
- b) Other ministry personnel in a covenantal relationship with a community of faith within the bounds of the regional council; and
- c) The lay members who are members of the United Church who are not ministry personnel and who are elected by their Communities of Faith.
- d) Appointed members, lay members of the Regional Council Executive who have not been elected by their Community of Faith.

That the quorum be as indicated in Section C.4.3 of the Manual 2022;

"The Regional Council may meet only if a minimum number of members is present... If there are 60 or more members, at least 20 members must be present; and that there be at least one ministry personnel and one lay member who is not ministry personnel present. Corresponding members are not counted for this purpose."

"That the bounds of the Regional Council meeting be the virtual meeting room, the telephone connections to that meeting space and Wesley United Church"

"That representatives of General Council; representatives of United Church organizations; ministry students not serving a pastoral charge; and any other registered visitors to the Regional Council meetings be Corresponding Members of this Council."

"That the agenda, as printed and distributed, be adopted as the agenda for this meeting of First Dawn Eastern Edge Regional Council, subject to such changes as may be adopted and such Orders of the Day as may be determined by the Council."

That the business table be Cecil Noseworthy and Stephanie McClellan.

That the minute secretary for the Fourth (4th) Annual Regional Council meeting be Jennifer Taylor.

The President will chair the meeting, making any rulings necessary. The Regional Council will work together using the Whole People's Covenant and Holy Manners as its guide. The President will apply the Manual 2022 Appendix: Procedures for Holding a Meeting and Decision-Making.

Bourinot's Rules of Order will be used as the authority should a question arise which is not answered by the Appendix.

Speakers will:

- Start by identifying themselves (name, Pastoral Charge or Community of Faith)
- All discussion should be directed to the President.
- Each person may address the President only once about a motion, except the mover, who may speak both first and last.
- That the initial time allocated for the mover to address the motion be limited to three
 (3) minutes.
- That all subsequent speakers limit their time to two (2) minutes, including any reply by the mover of the motion.
- · All discussion should be clear and concise and deal only with the motion.
