Donkin/Morien/Birch Grove Pastoral Charge (Nova Scotia)

Title: Donkin-Morien-Birch Grove Pastoral Charge fonds

Dates: 1867; 1879-2008; 2010-2021

Extent: 61 cm of textual records

Administrative History: A pastoral charge consists of one or more communities of faith (known as preaching points prior to 2019) under the spiritual leadership of a minister. The pastoral charge title usually reflects the breadth of the geographic area encompassing the charge.

The Donkin-Morien-Birch Grove Pastoral Charge is composed of the communities of faith of St. Luke's United Church (Donkin) and St. John's United Church (Port Morien) which are both located in Cape Breton County, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia.

In 1925, the Congregational, Methodist, and most Presbyterian Churches were united into one denomination--The United Church of Canada. At this time, St. Luke's Presbyterian Church in Donkin became St. Luke's United Church, forming its own pastoral charge. St. John's Presbyterian Church in Morien became St. John's United Church under its own pastoral charge of Morien. Broughton and Birch Grove formed a pastoral charge as well.

In 1936, Port Morien Pastoral Charge and Birch Grove-Broughton Pastoral Charge formed the new pastoral charge of Port Morien-Birch Grove-Broughton with the preaching points of Birch Cove, Broughton, and Port Morien. Broughton was closed around 1943. By 1945, Morien and Birch Grove once again formed two separate pastoral charges.

Donkin Pastoral Charge amalgamated with the Morien Pastoral Charge in 1947 to form the Donkin-Morien Pastoral Charge with the preaching points of Donkin and Morien. Birch Grove Pastoral Charge became part of the Donkin-Morien Pastoral Charge in 1969, forming the Donkin-Morien-Birch Grove Pastoral Charge with the preaching points of Birch Grove, Donkin, and Morien.

MacKay Memorial United Church in Birch Grove was disbanded in 2006 and the building was sold that same year.

Effective January 1, 2019, The United Church of Canada underwent some structural changes including the elimination of all Presbyteries. At this time, Donkin/Morien/Birch Grove Pastoral Charge became part of Regional Council 15.

Custodial History: Information about the custody of these records prior to acquisition is incomplete.

Title: St. Luke's Presbyterian Church (Donkin) records

Dates: 1885-1903; 1906-1925

Extent: 8.5 cm of textual records

Administrative History: The origins of the Presbyterian congregation in Donkin was most likely a service conducted by Rev. Dr. Hugh MacLeod who was a minister at the Presbyterian church in Mira beginning in 1850. A church was built at Schooner Pond around 1860 to serve the communities of Sand Lake, Big Glace Bay, and Schooner Pond. The congregation in Donkin became a mission station connected with St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Glace Bay when it was founded in 1867. Donkin became a separate congregation in 1906 and adopted the name St. Luke's Presbyterian Church. A coal mine was opened around 1900 in Big Glace Bay and St. Luke's was moved to serve the miners in that area. In 1906, a coal mine was opened in Dominion #6 (Donkin) and the church was moved back to Donkin. A manse was built in that same year. A new building was built in 1913 and dedicated on May 7, 1914. St. Luke's Presbyterian Church became part of The United Church of Canada in 1925.

Donkin Pastoral Charge amalgamated with the Morien Pastoral Charge in 1947 to form the Donkin-Morien Pastoral Charge with the preaching points of Donkin and Morien. Birch Grove Pastoral Charge became part of the Donkin-Morien Pastoral Charge in 1969, forming the Donkin-Morien-Birch Grove Pastoral Charge with the preaching points of Birch Grove, Donkin, and Morien.

Title: St. John's Presbyterian Church (Port Morien) records

Dates: 1867; 1879-1925

Extent: 5 cm of textual records and 1 photograph

Administrative History: In 1832, Scottish Presbyterian settlers settled in the Port Morien area. A Presbyterian church was built in 1842 in Black Brook. The first person to conduct services was Donald Ross, a layperson. The first service held by a Presbyterian minister in Port Morien was doubted by Dr. Hugh MacLeod, who served the congregation in Mira. In 1866, a new Presbyterian church was built in Port Morien. On January 1, 1868, Port Morien was separated from Mira to become its own pastoral charge. Rev. D. MacDougall was installed as the first minister of the Port Morien church on February 26, 1868. A new church building was dedicated on February 16, 1902 and called St. John's Presbyterian Church. In 1925, St. John's Presbyterian Church joined The United Church of Canada.

The Presbyterian Church in Birch Grove was connected with Port Morien as a mission station until Birch Grove and Broughton became a separate congregation in 1920.

Dates: 1946-2006

Extent: 6 cm of textual records

Administrative History: In 1925, the Presbyterian church in Birch Grove became part of The United Church of Canada as part of the Birch Grove-Broughton Pastoral Charge.

In 1936, Port Morien Pastoral Charge and Birch Grove-Broughton Pastoral Charge formed the new pastoral charge of Port Morien-Birch Grove-Broughton with the preaching points of Birch Cove, Broughton, and Port Morien.

Although the history is unclear, it appears as if the congregation in Birch Grove was known first as Victoria Presbyterian Church and then Victoria United Church. It appears as if Victoria United Church purchased property from Dominion Coal Co. in 1938. On September 17, 1939, a church building was dedicated. It is unclear when this church became known as MacKay Memorial United Church.

By 1945, Morien and Birch Grove once again formed two separate pastoral charges.

Birch Grove Pastoral Charge became part of the Donkin-Morien Pastoral Charge in 1969, forming the Donkin-Morien-Birch Grove Pastoral Charge with the preaching points of Birch Grove, Donkin, and Morien.

MacKay Memorial United Church was disbanded in 2006 and the building was sold that same year.
