



GATHERING Gathering

The annual meeting, held by zoom video conferencing, opened at 5:00pm for members to gather and to test connections.

CALL TO ORDER Call to Order

The President, Jane McDonald, welcomed everyone to the fourth annual meeting of Regional Council 15, and called the meeting to order. The President welcomed everyone to this meeting of the regional council.

ACKNOWLEDGING THE LAND

Jane McDonald, President, acknowledged the land on which we walk, live and gather, as the traditional unceded territory of the Wolastoqiyik, Mi'kmaq and Peskotomuhkati peoples. This territory is covered by the "Peace and Friendship Treaties". We gather with respect for all peoples of this region. We are all treaty people.

QUORUM AND CONSTITUTION OF THE REGIONAL COUNCIL

The President noted that there was a quorum present, and constituted the council in the name of Jesus Christ, the head of the church, for all the business that shall properly come before it.

OPENING WORSHIP

Opening worship was led by Sandra Tomsons, President-Elect. Prayer, song and scripture were offered to help animate the theme *We Are Not Alone: Reimagining Community* and to offer thanks and praise for this gathering. The President-Elect offered a scripture reading from 1Corinthians 12:3-13, and asked the members gathered to reflect on a theme question, based on Matthew's Beatitudes, *is the spirit of God in you calling you to be salt and light in your communities of faith?* The members shared, in unison, the New Creed. Music ministry was offered by video presentations of *I am the Church, Make Me a Channel of Your Peace, and One More Step Along the World I Go.*

THEME I

The President welcomed the theme presenter, Rev. Dr. Anna Robbins, President of Acadia Divinity College and Dean of Theology, Acadia University. The theme presenter began her presentation to the region by looking back; reflecting on the stories of the past. THEME II

Dr. Robbins continued her presentation on reimagining community, and how difficult change can be, especially as we are struggling to understand the environment around us. We have to adapt to seeing our community from a different view, a higher up view, to see what is really happening around us. The theme presenter introduced the members to the concept of cultural malaise; where there is a loss of the sense of a higher power, or loss of belief in God. In this cultural malaise, people asked themselves, "is that all there is?" If there is no meaning; no purpose, then grab the moment and live in the now. Over time, our thoughts moved towards a naturalistic sense of the world, where there was a shift towards seeking a scientific answer to "who are we?". People are looking for meaning, but they are finding it elsewhere and not from the church; finding purpose in the moment. We are doing anything to distract ourselves from the fact that there may not be anything else meaningful to life. We work to escape on the weekend, or holiday; to look at the world with ourselves as the centre. This has been exacerbated by the pandemic. People are now desperate for connection, but do not know where to find it. This crisis of meaning becomes a crisis of theodicy. We provide for ourselves through consumerism what God used to provide. We need to envision a new kind of community to find something to connect with and work towards. Strategic planning involves visioning, with strategies and tactics to move in that direction. The theme presenter asks that we encourage one another, even when tactics fail. There will be challenges, but it is not hopeless. It is a daunting task for the church, but regardless of what we are facing, we are not alone. This is a God-given opportunity to know who we are. It is a unique calling for churches to form new connections and plan for the future.

It was noted that the budget for 2023 shows very few changes from 2022, given that we are still operating in these pandemic times, and have not had the opportunity to gauge regular operating expenses since entering the new structure. The changes noted in the budget are mainly due to an increase in staff salaries; due to a new policy for equality with ministry personnel and lay salaries, and cost of living adjustments. Some decreases noted are based on actuals from 2021. The budget is presented as a deficit budget; however, the hope is that 2022-23 will allow the region a better look at normal operations and how to budget to live within our means. This deficit will be covered by previous surplus in regional council funds.

Murray introduced the council to the six theme words from the strategic plan: deep spirituality, bold discipleship, daring justice; words that represent all that the United Church stands for; and how we live our ministry together, as we work to become our best selves and commit to this vision with humility and respect. Murray Pruden reported that the GCO is continuing its work on the anti-racism action plan. This plan includes goals for education, healing and accountability. Murray also updated the regional council on General Council 44 (GC44). The work of GC44 continues with decision making sessions in July and the election of a new Moderator. Murray also brings greetings on behalf of the National Indigenous Council (NIC), which has a proposal for restructuring before the General Council. The Council is striving for identity, and for equity. Murray shared that so much has changed since the discovery of unmarked graves in Kamloops. It has been a hard road to walk, and the NIC is working with the General Council on an initiative to bring the children home and to raise a totem in memory of missing children. Murray offered a reflection as we approach National Indigenous People's Day, and thanked the council for allowing him to be present to bring greetings.

Affirm United encourages communities of faith to look at barriers to those coming to your ministry and community, and offers resources to developing a plan of action. Inspired by the transformative movement of the Spirit, Region 15 commits itself to becoming an Affirming Ministry within the United Church of Canada, one that welcomes all people, including people of all sexual orientations and gender identities to fully participate in all aspects of the life and work of its ministry.

As an Affirming Ministry, we acknowledge the harm caused by exclusionary views about sexuality, love and gender identity. We acknowledge that these views did not and do not reflect the abundant love of God. We acknowledge the Churches' part in the trauma caused to those who have been marginalized.

Striving to be faithful followers of Jesus in our time and place, Regional Council 15 (RC15) commits itself and its members:
