FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

2024 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

April Hart, chair of the Division of Finance and Administration, presented the 2024 audited financial statements. A detailed account of the region's finances was presented during a webinar on May 6, 2025. The chair led the regional council members through the audited financial statements, noting the importance of the auditor's declaration that the statements present fairly....the financial position of the Council. The chair highlighted the increase in deposits, as cash was moved to investments, and how the investment of these funds has placed the region in a very strong financial position, as well as the anticipated reduction in the grant from the General Council from 2023. For clarification, the chair offered a definition of unrestricted and restricted funds in the region. The chair thanked the Financial Accountability and Investments Committee for their valuable work on the review of the statements.

MOTION: (April Hart/Mary-Beth Moriarity)

That the 2024 audited financial statements for Bermuda-Nova Scotia Regional Council be accepted as presented.

<u>Budget 2026</u>

April Hart, chair of the Division of Finance and Administration, presented the budget for 2026. A detailed report on the budget was presented at the May 6, 2025 webinar. The chair noted that there are not expected to be any changes in the Mission and Service grant for 2026. The chair highlighted the increase in rental revenue for 2026, as well as several increases in expenditures, including cost of living adjustments and step increases for salaries. A new line expenditure for the audit, which was not previously broken out in the budget, and the end of the Cluster Animator position was noted. The chair reported that the budgeted amounts proposed for 2026 are relatively stable, as we have begun to live into the new structure. It was noted that while a deficit budget is presented, a surplus of \$89,682.16 (eighty-nine thousand six hundred and eighty-two dollars and sixteen cents) is projected for 2026, based on revenue from investments; indicating a strong financial position for the region.

The President thanked the members gathered for the opportunity and privilege of serving the region in this way, and offered her best wishes to incoming President, Rev. Dr. Mary Taylor.

Executive Minister

EXECUTIVE MINISTER

The Executive Minister, Faith March-MacCuish, offered her remarks to the members gathered. The Executive Minister began by highlighting her report, contained on pages 15-19 in the reports to the region. The Executive Minister presented details and the theological groundings from an important internal report, which will be used for conversation across the church about "looking toward 2035". The Executive Minister highlighted data from the report which provides context for The United Church of Canada's vision for 2035; paying attention to strategically making sure we have a United Church presence in geographical areas across the country. The General Council hopes this will lead to positive changes in places where there are United Churches. It will be a collaborative initiative of the General Council, Regional Councils and congregations to better reflect the diversity of Canadian communities.

The Executive Minister also highlighted some of the regional work around rematriation (reparation). Rematriation is a spiritual journey, which for the United Church, began decades ago with the first apology to Indigenous peoples. In essence, rematriation is about reconciliation and justice. Recently steps have been taken, including discussions with the Tatamagouche Board and the Women of First Light, the establishment of a transition team and the development of a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to return the land and the Tatamagouche Centre to the Women of First Light.

Rev. Dr. Andrew Richardson, Office of Vocation Minister for the eastern regions, welcomed students and candidates for ministry to the council. Welcome and congratulations were extended to Barbara Blois-MacNaughton, Angela Clifton, Jessie Crabtree, Katie Logan, Max Martin, Dana Pardy, Rhonda Schofield, Marty Clark-Ettinger, and Dale Crawford; being Ordained to The United Church of Canada on June 1, 2025, at the Celebration of Ministries service. The celebrants were welcomed to the regional council and given two minutes to speak to introduce themselves.

The on-line portion of the annual meeting, held by zoom video conferencing, continued at 5:00pm on Thursday evening.

CALL TO ORDER Call to Order

Donna Tourneur, President, welcomed members back to the next session of the seventh annual meeting, and introduced the pastoral care volunteers for this evening. The President reminded the members gathered of the Holy Manners, as a resource for meeting conduct, and the equity self-monitoring questions.

<u>WORSHIP</u> <u>Worship</u>

The President, Donna Tourneur, invited the members to gather in worship. The President thanked Rev. Dr. Mary Taylor, President-Elect, and the worship team for their leadership in preparing this worship. The President lit the Christ and Affirm candles, and offered prayer, scripture and hymns to reflect on the theme "Deep Spirituality and Bold Discipleship". A scripture reading was shared by Ben MacLean from 1 Corinthians 12:12-14. Donna Tourneur, President shared the reflection *Living into a Dare*. The President asked members to consider *What does the world need most today?* and share their thoughts in the chat. Music leadership was offered by Alex Lank and members of Trinity United Church choir, New Glasgow, leading the selection *I Feel the Winds of God Today*.

REGIONAL COUNCIL STRUCTURE EVALUATION

Regional
Council
Structure
Evaluation

The President welcome Jenny Stephens, consultant, to the regional council. The consultant provided an update on the evaluation of the regional council structure, including the context for the report, process, scope, and key findings; noting that the full report will be available in late June. The consultant began with a scripture reading from 1 Peter 2:4-5 and 9. The consultant reviewed the current structure, mission and pillars, as the current governance and goals identified by the region. The members gathered were reminded of the evaluation question: is the regional council living into its potential for enhancing call and ministry as it is in relationship with communities of faith and faith leaders. Over the course of the evaluation, the consultant completed surveys, attended meetings, and reviewed minutes, newsletters and governance documents. The consultant noted that there was some disappointment in the survey response rates, with an approximately 27% (twenty-seven) response rate among the four surveys.

The consultant reminded members that there is a significant change curve that occurs with big change. The 2019 restructuring of the United Church caused great disruption, resulting in fear and resistance.

Recovery from disruption takes time, before acceptance and openness brings confidence in the new.

The consultant provided key findings, including the fact that regional members are offering the best leadership they can in this time of transition and that the region has made steps towards fulfilling its mandate; however, communities of faith crave more connection. Respondents feel that the governance structure needs to be simplified and dependant on fewer volunteers. Data was shared from the results of each of the four surveys, highlighting key points based on the feedback received.

In conclusion, the consultant offered that it is felt that the current organizational structure is not serving the region well. Widely held organizational principles to guide the next steps include having decision making closer to the issue or task; empowering volunteers and staff; focusing on those served; listening to one another; streamlining and strengthening; being flexible; ensuring strategic focus that requires fewer volunteers. The consultant offered a possible new structure, as an example of how to encompass these principles, with the work lodged in three (3) commissions; requiring fewer people with networks, and clusters feeling supported; with additional networks and clusters where needed.

The consultant invited members to move into small groups, using breakout rooms, to consider the following from the information presented: any surprises?; what's missing?; what do you notice?; what do you wonder about? Members were asked to send in the notes from their discussions to add to the data for the evaluation.

The President thanked Jenny Stephens for her extensive work on the evaluation and for her presentation and attendance at the meeting. The President expressed that the region looks forward to seeing the full report in June.

The AST President provided members with an introduction to AST, and highlighted the graduate and degree programs available, as well as diploma programs, which offer a broad introduction to theology and faith formation by distance. The President introduced a new certificate in stewardship, the new Atlantic School of Discipleship and highlighted some of the continuing education courses available this year. The President, Donna Tourneur, thanked the AST President for her presentation and for her attendance at the annual meeting.

Members of the region, dressed in costumes, from various times in our history, presented a series of vignettes from the beginning of The United Church in 1925 through to 1965. The vignettes used skits, photos, headlines and song to highlight the early growth and world events taking place as the church was developing in the first forty years. News stories, United Church groups, song and scripture helped animate the story of The United Church of Canada.

THEME Theme

Theme Presenter, Rev. Janet Gear was welcomed to the gathering of the regional councils. The theme presenter began with the first session, entitled *The Language Faith Speaks*. Rev. Janet Gear shared a story to illustrate that faith has been here all along; a gift from the spirit to be the fuel for our lives together. The theme presenter welcomed a panel, made from members from the regions, who will help to animate the sessions; tied together as a Banquet of Living Faith; to see in one another the community that faith calls us to be.

Members were first invited to note a phrase beginning with the words I believe..., and hold it close to their hearts. The theme presenter asked the panelists What is your faith making you want to do? based on pictures showing different expressions of faith, such as helping others, participating in worship, being present where there is need, and introducing others to God. Janet Gear introduced the members to a colour coded chart to demonstrate the root of faith and the expressions of faith that come from that root; evangelical, ecclesial, missional, ecumenical and spiritual. It was noted that there are prejudices and concerns associated with each label. During the session, the theme presenter and panelists explored these various ways of life and love, exploring what the church should be doing, what it means to belong to that church community, what the world would stand to lose without this gesture of the body of Christ, and how to pray using each of the theological roots discussed.

INDIGENOUS WELCOME

Sherpherd Munikwa, Minister for Justice, Mission and Outreach, introduced Nicole Porter and invited her to bring greetings. Nicole is Mi'kmag from Fort Folly First Nation, and is an LPN, Holistic Nurse Coach, knowledge keeper, and a Mi'kmaq Cultural Coordinator. Our Indigenous guest welcomed the members gathered to the land of her ancestors. Nicole shared stories from her community, and her early life without her ancestral culture and language. Nicole now works to share stories from her culture and honored her grandfather by sharing a welcome song and the prayer Our Father in Mi'kmaq. Our Indigenous guest also prepared a smudge to clear burdens as we come together with open hearts and open minds.

Panelists shared their faith stories, how they journeyed into their expressions of faith, and how they represent each of the five identified roots of faith. Robyn Brown-Hewitt introduced the next presentation, animating the church through the years 1965-2005. The presenter gave thanks for the many volunteers who have offered their time and talents in the presentations of the history of the United Church, in celebration of the 100th anniversary.

The first portion of this celebration presentation, *Broadening*, offered highpoints from the next 20 (twenty) years of the church's history through the game show "UCC Jeopardy". Highlights included the United Church's use of inclusive language, the installation of the first female moderator of the United Church, and the decline in membership of the church for the first time since its union. The play continued with a session of the next 20 (twenty) years, using a doctor-patient session to discuss the evolving identity of the church; including the *A Place for You* report, the first apologies, work towards reconciliation and inclusivity, and the introduction of a new hymn book.

Worship team members led the members gathered in a Missional Worship; as one of the five expressions of faith noted by the theme presenter. Mary Taylor and Emma Taylor offered reflection and prayer based on a scripture reading from Micah 6:8. Music leadership was offered by Christopher Lane and Alicia Walls with the selection *Christ has no Body Now but Yours*. The President thanked the worship team for the thoughtful worship pieces offered.

THEME III

Theme Presenter, Rev. Janet Gear was welcomed back to the regional councils. The theme presenter began the third session, entitled *One and Not the Same*, with a reading from Jan Richardson's *Blessings for Pentecost*. A new panel was presented, to help animate the presentation through discussion and conversation.

The theme presenter offered highlights from the first two sessions, and introduced the next session, moving from faith developed beneath the surface to expressions of our lived faith and Christian identity. The presenter highlighted the strengths and shadows of each faith expression; intimacy, commitment, concrete, scope and discipline for strengths and exclusive, consumerist, naïve, ideological and self, for shadows. Although difficult to see our own personal shadows, it is important to recognize and acknowledge what can go wrong and continue to work on improving. The antidotes for the shadows are found in collaboration and relationship with the varied communities of faith expressions. The panelists each shared their perspectives of the strengths, shadows and depths that they have experienced in their own faith journeys. The President, Sue LeMaistre, thanked the theme presenter and panelists for their honest, hopeful, presentations.
